- 2). Love the unloved and reach out to those who do not have what we have. He was talking about his son's shooter and how many people didn't recognize the warning signs before it was too late.

Along with Rev Lang's message was an active silent auction with over 100 items ranging from dinner gift certificates to a combination coffee maker and toaster! It was a good evening with lots of laughs, some tears and a building excitement toward Hermosa's future.
